Section B (20 marks)

Read the following newspaper story and answer all the questions.

LUCKY DOG SURVIVES 16 DAYS UNDERGROUND

After being trapped for 16 days down a 22-metre hole, a dog named Buck has been rescued by rangers in the Great Smoky Mountains National Park.

"The dog was thin and bruised, but was able to walk around," Ranger Rick Brown said. He had spent several hours on Tuesday using ropes to climb down the hole and rescue the dog, a two-year-old blond Mountain Cur, a breed similar to a Labrador.

On Monday campers had heard a dog barking and went to investigate. About 250 metres from their campsite, they found a large hole and heard a dog barking from inside it. The campers then asked a builder, working nearby, for help. Using a rope, he was able to get close enough to the edge of the hole to see the dog about 12 metres down, but couldn't reach him. That evening, park rangers were called to the hole but they couldn't hear the dog.

Rick Brown and three other rangers then returned to the hole at 10 a.m. on Tuesday. Brown climbed 12 metres down to a ledge, but there was no sign of the dog. Using a light, he found a small opening on the ledge and a second hole. Looking through the opening, he saw the dog lying quietly at the bottom, another 10 metres down. When he called out, the dog stood up and looked at him. After reaching the dog, he held it in his arms while the other three rangers used the ropes to pull them both out of the hole at 3p.m.

Buck wore a collar identifying his owner, a man who had lost the dog while hunting 16 days before. The owner was very appreciative to get Buck back on Wednesday. The park doesn't plan to send him a bill for the recovery.
