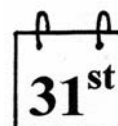
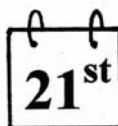

The topic I'm going to talk about today is whales. _____ (1) whales live in the sea, they are mammals, and like all mammals they breathe air into **lungs**, are warm-blooded, breast-feed their _____ (2), and have some (although very little) hair. Whales breathe through **blowholes**, located on the top of the head. They have a unique breathing system that _____ (3) them stay underwater for long periods of time without taking in any oxygen. Some whales, such as the *Sperm Whale*, can _____ (4) underwater for up to two hours holding a single breath. They can be huge, for example, the *Blue Whale* can be up to 30 metres long and _____ (5) 180 tons and is the largest known animal that has ever lived. Whales are broadly classed as **predators**, they hunt and kill other animals for food, and _____ (6) food ranges from tiny plankton to very large fish.

Many people _____ (7) that whales are highly **intelligent** animals. Some claim that whales are more intelligent than humans, but it is hard to say how intelligent whales really are.
