The Teddyphone

A mobile phone shaped like a teddy-bear, designed for children as young as three, is now on sale in the shops.

The Japanese company which makes the Teddyphone says it can help parents contact their children at any time of the day or night. It also helps the children because they can speak to their parents whenever they want to, and they can learn about how to use a telephone from a very young age.

The company says that they have made the phone extra safe for children. The Teddyphone does not use as much radiation as a normal phone. This is important because children's brains are still growing. In addition, they say children will never get unwanted calls from strangers because the Teddyphone can only make calls to, or receive calls from, four numbers chosen by parents.

However, not everyone is happy about the idea of phones for very young children. Firstly, people say that there is no need for such young children to use phones. Young children are never away from the protection of a parent or responsible adult for more than two or three minutes at a time anyway.

Secondly, some people don't think the telephone is a good idea because the children will not find it easy to use. They will quickly forget about it and lose it or break it when they are bored with it. They may even forget that it's a phone and think of other games to play with it, like imagining it is a gun, or a boat, or something to eat.
