- first name 1 mark

The address may be fictional but must be plausible in that it is convincing. The postcode/zipcode may be left blank if none seems to be needed. Take one mark off however if something which is clearly not a postcode/zipcode e.g. a town is put in this space.

- Age 1 mark
- Dob 1 mark accept 30 10 94 , 10 30 94 30(th) December (19)94 December 30(th) (19)94; no mark for this year or no year.
- Interests 1 mark single words or whole sentence acceptable
- 1 marks for overall look of the form – legible? spelling? clear? etc
