General English

The General English course is **15 hours per week delivered in the morning**. You will learn English through a balance of activities aimed at improving your grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation and the skills of reading, writing, speaking and listening. Throughout your programme there will be a strong emphasis on English for Communication. You can also prepare for Cambridge and/ or **Anglia** exams at an appropriate level. You will be given a course book for your core English classes, which is included in your tuition fee. You must bring it with you to each class. You will be given an initial assessment to determine which class is most suitable to develop your level and understanding of English. The initial assessment will cover all the skills. You will be given homework and class tests at regular intervals in order to assess and monitor your progress. Mornings are divided into two classes. The first class starts at 9.15am and finishes at 10.45am. The second class starts at 11.00am and ends at 12.30pm. The programme has been designed to ensure that every student follows a course of study suitable for their level of competence in English. Minimum study period is 2 weeks.

English Extra

You can also develop your English Language ability and then learn new skills to put your language into practice. You can choose 1 or 2 extra subjects **in addition to your General English classes**. Each option is five hours per week. Subjects are studied in the afternoon between 13.30 and 16.15. One subject is two afternoons of 2.5 hours each. You can choose a maximum of 2 subjects.
